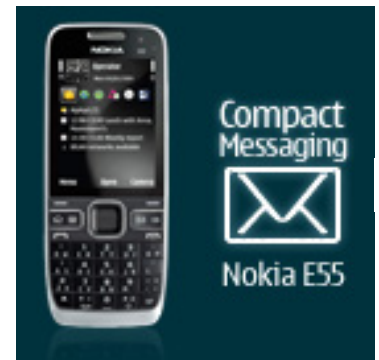
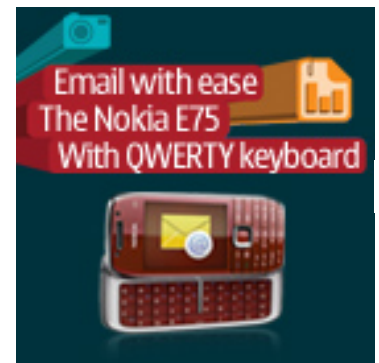
Two New Eseries Devices Optimized for Efficiency
